Monday

Martial Arts

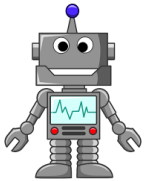
Students will learn self-discipline, improve their focus, and strengthen their physical abilities through the ancient martial art of Taekwondo. The classes taught by Telesco's Martial Arts will focus on blocks, kicks, punches, strikes, balance, self-defense and even weapon techniques (wooden swords). Martial arts is an excellent tool for physical fitness and character development alike!



Grades: K-3 (Minimum 8 students)

"Radical Robots!"



Robots are important manufacturing, medicine, and space exploration. In this course, students will explore the basic and complex technology used to design and build robots. Discover how machines and robots work and how they make our lives easier. Students will learn about simple machines, gear structure, gear ratios, battery wiring, motor principles, and electronic circuits. They will experiment with different forms of locomotion, including wheels, legs, and tracks. Students will even build a robot that they take home at the end of the program!

"A Class Act"

SDSC Performing Arts Director Mrs. Manning will teach students every aspect of the theatre world, including costuming and set building. They will learn about storytelling, script reading, character development, pantomime, improvisation and more! Students will gain confidence and improve their public speaking skills. This course ends with a public performance of a play on December 6th and 7th!

Intensive Volleyball Clinic

Students in Grades 7 and 8 can participate in an intensive volleyball clinic. Students will learn the fundamentals of passing, serving and hitting. Open to new and experienced players, this clinic is perfect for students who intend to play volleyball in high school. Students should bring sneakers and knee pads to school.

Sew Happy: Happy Hedgehog!

Have fun with Sew Happy's latest project, a Hedgehog Woodland Basket. Students will construct an adorable square basket which is decorated with trees and woodland flora and fauna on the outside but becomes the cozy home of a hedgehog family on the inside. Students will learn how to thread a needle, tie a knot, pin, and stitch. Beginners are welcome at this class and experienced sewers will love working on a new project! Sewing is great for hand-eye coordination, fine motor skills and focus!

Soccer Skills Clinic

Students will be provided with soccer skills training by the coaches at vonEgypt Soccer Academy founded by SDSC alumni and professional soccer player, Nick vonEgypt. This clinic is designed to help students at any level improve their skills on the soccer field! Each student will receive needs-based, personalized, dynamic and fun training. Students should bring sneakers/gym shoes and shin guards to school.

Volleyball Academy

 This program will introduce students in Grades 4-6 to the fundamentals of volleyball. Students will learn passing, serving, setting and hitting. This program will help students develop basic skills of the game in a positive and encouraging environment. Students should bring sneakers and knee pads to school.

Students will learn stage presence, projection, diction, choreography, set design, sound, lighting and more. Fall Musical Theater has roles for students in Grades 1 through 8. For this production, lead roles will be given to students in Grades 1 through 4. Students in Grades 5-8 will be cast in supporting roles, given leadership positions and assigned to mentor our younger performers.

- All Program times and dates will be posted on the School Calendar.
- All Programs begin immediately after dismissal of the regular school day.
- Soccer, Volleyball and Robotics dismiss at 4:15 p.m.
- Acting and Musical Theater may have special rehearsal times and schedules. The schedules will be communicated by Mrs. Manning and will be posted on the School Calendar.
- Unless otherwise indicated, all other activities are held from 3:00 p.m. — 4:00 p.m.
- All registrations are accepted in the order they are received. Once an activity reaches a participation limit, additional registrants will be placed on a wait list.
- Any class that does not reach its minimum enrollment will be cancelled.
- All activities are supervised by Safer Spaces qualified adults.
- Students not picked up at the scheduled end time will be dismissed to the After School Program and fees will be charged accordingly.
- Activities are not held when school is dismissed early or not in session. Make-up sessions may be scheduled at the discretion of the activity coordinator.
- There is a registration of \$40 per class.
- Activity fees include all supplies and/or equipment.
- The SDSC After School Enrichment Program is made possible through a grant from the Office of the Superintendent of Schools of the Archdiocese of New York. This grant covers the majority of the costs associated with operating our enrichment programming.
