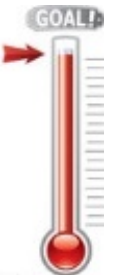
SDSC Annual Walk-a-thon – ALMOST THERE!!

Sadly, these tragedies **do** happen, and they have happened **in our local community**. **ALL PARENTS/GUARDIANS SHOULD ATTEND THIS ANTI-BULLYING ASSEMBLY FOR PARENTS ON MONDAY, NOVEMBER 5TH AT 6:30 P.M.** **For every family who attends this assembly, the child(ren) in that family will receive a NUT Award (No Uniform Today) to be used on a day of their choice.** With the explosion of electronic media, cyberbullying often begins at a very early age. This information is important for parents of ALL students, regardless of the child's age. We need to take a stand as a school and faith community and together work to put an end to bullying and its devastating effects – for our children!

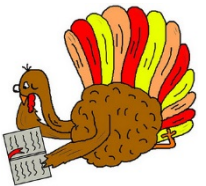
Family BINGO and Pasta Dinner – Friday November 9th

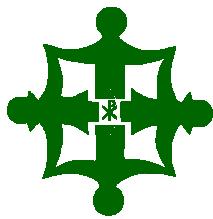
No School – November 12th

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As you know St. Denis-Columba School has implemented a comprehensive bullying prevention program. We are committed to taking serious, proactive steps to curb a problem that is found in schools everywhere. Our efforts this year have focused on raising awareness about bullying and cyber bullying with students and parents.

We have recruited Mr. John Halligan to conduct a presentation on November 5th for our students in Grades 5-8. He will relay his own tragic experience as a Dad whose 13-year old son took his own life in 2003 after incessant bullying by peers since the fifth grade, both in school and online. Mr. Halligan further shares that Ryan wrestled with underlying mental health issues and depression. These factors, too, contributed to Ryan's vulnerability and ultimate suicide. His story is riveting and powerful, and reminds students that there is a face, a person, a heart, on the other end of the screen.

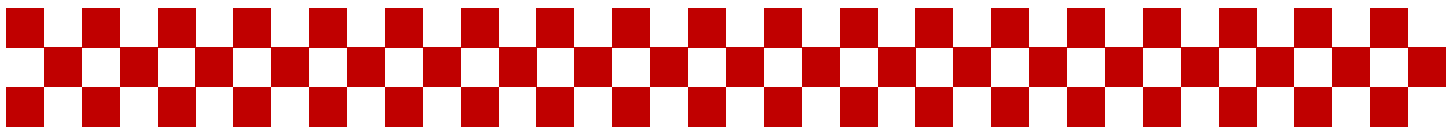
Mr. Halligan's presentation will begin with a short video collection of home movie clips and pictures of Ryan. He will then begin to tell the story of Ryan and the factors that led up to his son's suicide. The students will gain a perspective from inside the family of a child who is a victim of bullying and cyber bullying. They will also gain awareness about the signs and risks of teenage suicide and how best to help a friend. As part of Mr. Halligan's presentation students will have the chance to ask him questions. We encourage you to visit a website named for his son: www.RyansStory.org for more information. Because of the sensitive nature of the topic, we wanted to inform you about it in advance. After the presentation we encourage you to ask your child(ren) about the presentation and discuss it together.

Mr. Halligan will be conducting a similar presentation for parents the evening of Monday, November 5th at 6:30 p.m. in the school gym. **ALL PARENTS ARE INVITED.** We *strongly* recommend that you come to hear John Halligan's story. His message is that important! We need to take a stand as a school and faith community and together work to put an end to bullying and its devastating effects – for our children! Babysitting will be provided that evening, if needed. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Sr. Kathleen Marie, CR at the school.
