Summer Assignments Grade 6-8

Each student will have a **Math and Language Arts Summer Boost** assigned in their **IXL account**. This will help solidify student understanding of key concepts and make sure they are ready to learn more in the next grade! Each Summer Boost assignment is composed of 20 skill lessons; these cover topics that the students should be familiar with in their present grade level. The program is adaptive; if the student gets a question wrong there is instruction to let the student know what the correct answer was and why. As students answer the questions their SMART Score grows. Students should work for a SMART Score of 90-100 on each assignment. Students can choose to do the assignments on any days they wish. **Students are also expected to work on their personal "Step into the Arena" skills.** All IXL assignments need to be completed by August 15th. This will allow for the system to be set up for next year and give the students a break to end the summer.

Math 6-8

Be sure to complete all of the assigned skills and review the math concepts for there will be a quiz the first week of school. **All incoming 6th-8th graders** should have mastery of basic facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division up through and including 12's.) **Algebra** students should have all perfect squares memorized up to 400 (20²) and should complete their summer assignments by August 15th.

ELA Assignments Grades 6-8

In addition to the above Summer Boost and "Step into the Arena" skills, all students will read one book (from the lists below for each grade) and complete a book report form that is attached at the end of this letter.

- Grades 6-7 Students are to read: Outlaws of Ravenhurst by Sr. M. Imelda Wallace S.L.
- Grade 8 Students are to read: The Bronze Bow (a Newbery Award Winner) by Elizabeth George Speare

Summer Religion Assignment for Grade 8

To prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation, you will be required to do the following:

- 1. Write a report on the saint you are choosing for Confirmation. In the first paragraph, discuss why you have chosen that saint. Give a LITTLE background information on the life of that saint but center your report on why you have chosen that particular saint.
- 2. In the second paragraph, discuss what name you have chosen and why (is it a family name? Does your family have a particular devotion to that saint? etc.)
- 3. In the third paragraph, discuss why Confirmation is such an important sacrament to receive in the 8th Grade.
- **4.** You will make a cover sheet with the words CONFIRMATION SAINT REPORT and put your name in the lower right-hand corner.
- 5. You will also have at least two illustrations on the cover.

FORMAT: Introduction: 4-5 sentences

Each body paragraphs (three of them): at least 8 sentences each

Conclusion: 4-5 sentences

IN ADDITION: 8th Graders are to bring to class on the FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL the following:

- 1. Your Confirmation Sponsor Sheet, Candidate Form, Service Hour Form, and a **Confirmation Fee of \$55** (checks made out to St. Columba). These forms can be downloaded on www.stcolumbaonline.org under the Religious Education Tab and Confirmation or from our website.
- 2. You will also bring in the attached form with the name you would like on your diploma. IT MUST HAVE A PARENT'S SIGNATURE.
- 3. A baby picture for the yearbook write your name on the back of the picture.
- 4. An appropriate quote for the yearbook with the author of the quote. Write on an index card with your name on the back.

School Uniform Requirements for 2023-2024 (Lil' Darling Shoppe)

Please review the following **School Uniform Policy for the 2023-2024 School Year** with your child; this will be enforced on a daily basis.

Boys in K-8

- White dress shirt (oxford for Grades K-8) and plaid school tie
- Green V-neck sweater vest or pullover V-neck sweater with school name
- Green dress slacks (purchased at Lil' Darling Shoppe)
- Black/Brown belt and dark socks
- Black or Brown supportive shoe with Shoelaces, strap, or Velcro (No slip-on or "Sperry" type boat shoes)
- Boys Hair cut should be simple, neat, above the collar, and off the face. No faddish haircuts, dyed or highlighted hair

Girls in 5-8

- Green Plaid uniform skirt (no more than 1 inch above knee) and white oxford blouse
- Green V-neck sweater vest or pullover V-neck sweater with school name
- Green or Black knee socks/tights
- Black or Brown supportive shoes with shoelaces, Velcro, or strap (No slip-on or "Sperry" type boat shoes)
- No dyed or highlighted hair.

Summer Uniform K-8

- Green shorts (no more than an inch above the knee) with belt
- Girls have skort option (to be purchased at Lil' Darling Shoppe)
- White polo shirt with school logo
- White crew socks that reach the ankle
- Black or Brown <u>supportive shoes</u> with shoelaces, Velcro, or strap (No slip-on or "Sperry" type boat shoes)

PLEASE NOTE: Uniform SNEAKERS for Gym - only WHITE or BLACK - with NO color
