School-wide NUTTY Days – Monday, April 4th and Wednesday, April 20th

Since our school community beat the \$20,000 Read-a-thon challenge (see below), the students have been awarded 5 school-wide NUTTY ("No Uniform Today – Thank You!) Days! These days will be announced to the students, added to the school website calendar and noted in the weekly newsletter. The first two NUTTY days are scheduled for this Monday, April 4th and Wednesday, April 20th.

No Uniform Day Dress Code: All No Uniform Day clothing must comply with the rules in the SDSC Parent-Student Handbook! As a reminder, the following items are prohibited: ripped or torn clothing, immodest clothing (e.g. crop tops, halter tops, miniskirts, low cut tops) and items with inappropriate words/sayings. Leggings are permitted only if covered by a top that extends to no less than 3 inches above the knees. Skirts All shoes must be safe and supportive – no sandals, sliders, ballet shoes or heels.
