Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament – Friday, March 10th



On Friday, March 10th all classes will visit the St. Columba Adoration Chapel where they will have the opportunity to pray before our Eucharistic Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. What is Eucharistic Adoration? Adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist (the Blessed Sacrament) is the process of coming before Christ in His entirety; His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity (we simply can't see Him) to contemplate His awesomeness and to lovingly adore Him. When we do this, we are in His Real Presence, able to speak with Him in our mind and our heart.

PRIORITY ENROLLMENT ENDS FRIDAY, MARCH 17th

There are two steps that families MUST complete to re-enroll all returning students.

- ① Complete the re-enrollment verification through TADS and pay the \$100 priority registration fee for each child.
- ② Complete and return to school district transportation forms even if your child never takes the bus. (Students not eligible for public transportation are exempt from this requirement.)

Both steps must be completed no later than Friday, March 17th in order to receive priority enrollment. *Once the priority period for re-enrollment ends for current SDSC families, available spaces will be offered to new applicants.*

HALF WAY THROUGH Quarter 3: Please be sure your Tuition and Fees are up to date!

We are more than half way through the Third Quarter! Check your children's growth and progress (as well as missing assignments) in YOUR TADS EDUCATE Parent Portal.

Also, as we anticipate third quarter report cards in April, we remind you that all financial requirements, including tuition payments (July- March), lunch IOUs, and After Care accounts must be current before you receive children's report cards. What is the Read-a-thon?

SDSC will hold a Read-a-thon to raise money to restore our Orton Gillingham literacy intervention program that provides students who struggle to read with intensive support to help them succeed. The Read-a-thon is not just a fundraiser; it's a multi-week adventure at SDSC with fun-filled activities that promote reading! The SDSC Read-a-thon runs from **Monday, March 13 to Wednesday, March 29.** The benefits will last a lifetime! Thank you for your support!

SCHOOLWIDE READ-A-THON EVENTS

- □ KICKOFF (Monday, March 13th): Today students will enjoy the last of the Walk-a-thon school-wide NUT awards as we kickoff our Read-a-thon with "Promote Reading" Day. Every student will receive a bookmark and a Dr. Seuss pencil.
 □ Scholastic Book Fair (Monday, March 13th Wednesday, March 15th) Students will have the opportunity purchase new books from our Scholastic Book Fair. A schedule for book fair visits will be provided by your child's teacher. Money for book purchases should be sent with your child in an envelope marked "book fair." You may also use the Scholastic "eWallet." More details about the eWallet will be forthcoming.
- Flashlight Friday (Friday, March 17th): It's lights out as we embark on a reading adventure in the dark. Students will bring flashlights to school for reading as "daytime turns into nighttime!"
- Lounge Around and Read (Wednesday, March 22nd): Today is a day to curl up with a good book! Students may wear comfy sweats or appropriate heavy loungewear. They may also bring a *small* blanket, pillow or stuffed animal. We will take some time to lounge around and read together.
- Team Up for Reading/Book Buddies (Monday, March 24th): Let's "team up" for reading! Our Upper Hall students will pair up with Lower Hall students for fun reading activities.
- Book Alive! (Tuesday, March 28th Wednesday, March 29th): Students may dress as an author or character from a book they are reading. All students are required to do a "Book Alive" Presentation, which could include a book review, a radio or TV commercial, a song or rap, an interview character, story-telling based on selection in book, memorize and recite an interesting passage, etc. Students will do class presentations and/or projects about a book that they read during the Read-a-thon. More details about the specific projects will be given by your child(ren)'s Homeroom Teachers.

SPONSORS AND READING GOALS

- All students will receive sponsor sheets from their teachers. Additional sponsor sheets will be emailed.
- Students are to set a goal for the minimum number of minutes that they will strive to read over the course of the Read-a-thon. A tracking sheet can be found on the back of the sponsor sheet. Be sure your child records all reading times and the total number of minutes at the end of each day. For our emerging readers, please record the time you read to or with your child. This counts too! Students are expected to practice the virtues of honesty and integrity when recording their reading minutes.
- Students are encouraged to find sponsors who will pledge a flat rate donation to support their Read-a-thon reading goal! Sponsors could include family, friends and neighbors. For safety reasons, door to door solicitation is discouraged.
